Responsibilities of the position include teaching courses within our B.S. in Forensic Science program, research, student mentoring, and university and community service. Applicants must have a Masters or Ph.D. in Forensic Science or a closely related field with experience teaching undergraduate courses such as forensic science. (ABD will be considered if award of Ph.D. degree can be expected before start of employment).
